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Notes from your Steering Group Le mot de votre conseil directeur

The February meeting of the OBS began with announcements of the upcoming Ikebana Workshops scheduled for February 24th and 25th and two OBS workshops; the Beginners, on April 21st and the Intermediate, on May 5th. Space in the bonsai workshops is limited so Members were advised to sign up early to avoid disappointment.

Most OBS Members know little about a new approach to styling led by bonsai Masters and artists, including Michele Andolfo and François Jeker that features "dynamic-balance" or "dynamic-equilibrium". The evening program was a presentation by Vianney Leduc on dynamic-balance, as it applies to styling a bonsai composition.

Vianney illustrated by comparing a tree designed in the classical Japanese style with another using dynamic-balance. Members agreed that both designs were very pleasing compositions; the classically-designed with characteristic visual stability; the dynamically balanced design with dramatic appeal.

Although rules are not laid down for dynamically-stable styling, Vianney presented four design elements that can add a dynamic aspect to any tree. Some of these elements were to give a direction to a tree and give movement to the shape of the foliage pads.

The presentation led to a discussion regarding the use of such dynamic elements by Japanese artists. Although many of the classical Japanese bonsai seen in books tend to be static and visually very stable, we have seen a few artists like Masahiko Kimura that has produced designs that are very dynamic.

Vianney brought an azalea to the meeting that he plans to restyle using dynamic-balance features and he invited suggestions from Members. It was a good exercise and afterwards he showed us a Paintshop rendition by Eric Langlois of Vianney's preferred design.

Vianney stressed that dynamic-balance will not replace but will add to the existing body of design knowledge and it lends itself to some styles such as cascade and windswept conifers more readily than to formal upright deciduous styles.

In the first part, we will explore sketching techniques as it can apply to bonsai. This will help participants who like to sketch design alternatives before starting their work. Spring is around the corner and it is now time to do actual work on some trees! Barney Shum will give a demonstration of design work on one of his trees in the second part of the meeting.

She will also brief us on the OBGC's dream of building a national botanical garden in Ottawa that would showcase Canadian native species and the horticultural discoveries that enabled the settlement of vast tracts of Canadian land.

Cet atelier s'adresse principalement à ceux et celles qui ont suivi le cours pour débutants du 26 novembre dernier ou un autre cours pour débutants dans le passé. 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

Meeting Location / Lieu des rencontres

Nos rencontres se tiennent à l'édifice #72 de la Ferme expérimentale centrale. Pour vous y rendre, prenez la direction sud sur la promenade Prince of Wales jusqu'au rond-point à l'intersection National Capital Driveway et Prince of Wales (qui est aussi l'entrée principale de la Ferme expérimentale et de l'Arboretum), où vous prendrez la direction Est menant à l'Arboretum. Une courte distance plus loin, à la première fourche, Prenez la route de gauche qui mène directement à l'édifice #72 (vous verrez une affiche juste en face de l'édifice, de l'autre côté du chemin, qui dit «Friends of the Farm» . Le stationnement est situé de part et d'autre de l'édifice.



Our meetings are held at Building #72 at the Central Experimental Farm. Heading south on Prince of Wales, at the traffic circle at the intersection of the N.C.C. Scenic Drive and Prince of Wales, the major entrance to the Experimental Farm and the Arboretum, exit east into the Arboretum. After a very short distance, where the road divides, turn left to Building #72 which will be down a short distance on your left. There is parking just before or just after the building. The entrance is on the street side (east side) and there is a sign reading "Friends of the Farm".
