Notes from your Steering Group Le mot de votre conseil directeur

Nakamura Lecture and Demonstration September 6th

What great luck - to have renowned Japanese Bonsai Master Susumu Nakamura give a lecture and demo for the public at the Embassy of Japan just two days before the OBS's Annual Show. We are still pinching ourselves!

Mr. Nakamura chose Ian McRea's Scot's pine for his styling demo. Noting the tree was a bit overgrown and after confirming there were no problems with surface roots and removing all dead branches, Nakamura carefully chose the front and primary branches explaining alternatives he would choose and those he would not. Then the fun began.

It is always interesting to hear the crowd reaction during a demo as unwanted branches are pruned. The "before and after images" attest that about 75% of the foliage was removed in the transition from pre-bonsai material to bonsai. Master Nakamura's excellent sketch showed us how Ian's tree should develop in the next three years to show quality (see included pictures).

Clearly Master Nakamura observed that OBS members could use a few tips on developing branch structure in pre-bonsai material and avoiding overgrowth. He chose Alan Fournier's Scot's pine to illustrate techniques that will be of great future value to members.

The lecture and demo was perhaps most remarkable because Master Nakamura was able to hold the interest of an audience that included persons with little prior knowledge of bonsai and "veterans", as he calls us. His presentation was done with great skill and humor and everyone learned a lot that delightful evening.

The OBS is grateful to the Officers and Staff of the Japanese Embassy who made Master Nakamura's visit possible and who so graciously included the OBS in their significant cultural event. We are pleased the public rewarded them with a full house and Master Nakamura with a standing ovation.

OBS 2007 ANNUAL SHOW September 8-9th

Well Master Nakamura's involvement did not end on September 6th! He was available with advice during the show setup September 7th and present for the Official Opening September 8th. Members especially appreciated his comments on styling their pre-bonsai and tips on their finished bonsai. We were delighted when he escorted Ambassador and Mrs. Nishida through our show and now understand Counsellor Yanagi's introducing him as Japan's "bonsai missionary".

BONSAI COURSE FOR BEGINNERS / COURS SUR LES BONSAÏS POUR DÉBUTANTS

The OBS will be conducting a bonsai course for beginners this Fall to be followed in the spring by a workshop during which participants will have the opportunity of developing their own bonsai using provided material. The theoretical course on bonsai fundamentals will follow the *Bonsai Design – Level 1* course developed by Barney Shum and Lynn Edmonds. On completion of this one day course (5-6 hours), participants will have the essential knowledge required to begin to develop bonsai for our climate zone. Lecture notes will be provided. Cost of this course is set at \$20 per person for OBS members and \$25 for non-members, to be paid at the start of the course.

DATE: Saturday, November 24, from 9:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Building #72, Central Experimental Farm

Le cours théorique repose sur les enseignements du manuel *Bonsai Design – Level 1* écrit par Barney Shum et Lyne Edmonds. Ce cours d'une journée (5-6 heures) fournira les éléments de base qui permettront à ceux et celles qui le suivront de commencer à former et à entretenir des bonsaïs dans nos conditions climatiques. Le manuel de base est écrit en anglais et le cours sera donné dans cette langue, mais l'instructeur principal, Vianney Leduc, se fera un plaisir de fournir des explications en français au besoin. Le prix de ce cours est fixé à 20\$ par personne pour les membres de la SBO et à 25\$ pour les non-membres, payable au début du cours



The sketch also provides the future look of the tree.**






Nos rencontres se tiennent à l'édifice #72 de la Ferme expérimentale centrale. Pour vous y rendre, prenez la direction sud sur la promenade Prince of Wales jusqu'au rond-point à l'intersection National Capital Driveway et Prince of Wales (qui est aussi l'entrée principale de la Ferme expérimentale et de l'Arboretum), où vous prendrez la direction Est menant à l'Arboretum. Une courte distance plus loin, à la première fourche, Prenez la route de gauche qui mène directement à l'édifice #72 (vous verrez une affiche juste en face de l'édifice, de l'autre côté du chemin, qui dit «Friends of the Farm» . Le stationnement est situé de part et d'autre de l'édifice.



Our meetings are held at Building #72 at the Central Experimental Farm. Heading south on Prince of Wales, at the traffic circle at the intersection of the N.C.C. Scenic Drive and Prince of Wales, the major entrance to the Experimental Farm and the Arboretum, exit east into the Arboretum. After a very short distance, where the road divides, turn left to Building #72 which will be down a short distance on your left. There is parking just before or just after the building. The entrance is on the street side (east side) and there is a sign reading "Friends of the Farm".
